2023 CERCLA Five-Year Review for Selected Cleanup Actions at the Paducah Gaseous Diffusion Plant

The U. S. Department of Energy (DOE) is initiating the process to conduct a Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act (CERCLA) Five-Year Review for the Paducah Gaseous Diffusion Plant (PGDP) site. Until a cleanup action allows for unrestricted use, Section 121(c) of CERCLA and the *Federal Facility Agreement for the Paducah Gaseous Diffusion Plant* require the lead agency (DOE) to review the selected cleanup actions every five years to ensure they remain protective of human health and the environment. Previous Five-Year Reviews were conducted in 2003, 2008, 2013, and 2018. The report for the 2023 CERCLA Five-Year Review is scheduled to be issued for review to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Kentucky Department for Environmental Protection in July 2023.
